

WHAT IS A UGA EXCHANGE PROGRAM?

UGA exchange programs are partnerships between UGA and other global universities/colleges. Students can attend one of 50 partner schools around the globe, all of which offer a wide variety of classes in almost every subject.

As an exchange student, you will have the opportunity to fully immerse yourself in the culture and lifestyle of your host country.

WHO QUALIFIES FOR AN EXCHANGE PROGRAM?

Ideally, applicants should be flexible, resourceful, and confident ambassadors of UGA abroad. Students must have a minimum 2.5 GPA (in some cases, 3.0) and be of at least sophomore standing during the exchange. Students must submit full applications, including recommendations, essays, and transcripts.

HOW LONG ARE THE EXCHANGE PROGRAMS?

Exchange programs are offered for a semester in fall or spring, or as a full academic year. Semester dates vary at each host institution.

DO I NEED TO KNOW A FOREIGN LANGUAGE?

Many partner universities offer instruction in English, so knowledge of a second language is not always required to participate; however, some programs have a minimum language requirement.

We recommend you enroll in a class in your host country's language before you leave or while you are abroad. These language skills may prove useful once you are in your host country and may make your experience more positive.

WHERE WILL I LIVE?

Housing arrangements and types vary by program. Consult an Global Education advisor for specific program information. Generally, campus housing is arranged by host institutions and will be paid for on-site; however, students may also live in off-campus residences, apartments, or homestays.

WHAT ARE MY COSTS AND FINANCIAL AID OPTIONS?

UGA students on exchange will pay a flat fee based on UGA's in-state tuition rates. Students are responsible for their own living costs, airfare, and other personal expenses. Many exchange programs do not permit students to work abroad. UGA HOPE/Zell Miller scholarships apply toward program costs, plus you may be eligible for merit- or need-based scholarships.

WHAT COURSES CAN I TAKE?

You may take courses in your major or minor area of study, in addition to core and electives. Courses taught at each institution vary; schedule an exchange advising appointment with our office to learn more.

HOW DO I RECEIVE COURSE CREDIT?

To receive transfer credit for classes taken on exchange, you must complete a Transfer Credit Approval Form before going abroad. Completion of the Transfer Credit Approval Form will confirm your study abroad participation, note the number of credits you are attempting abroad, and maintain your overall student and financial status at UGA.

HOW CAN I LEARN MORE?

Attend an Global Education 101 session hosted by the Office of Global Engagement. Then, you can meet with an Global Education advisor to learn more about UGA exchange programs and the application process. Your academic advisor may also have information about programs that suit your individual needs. 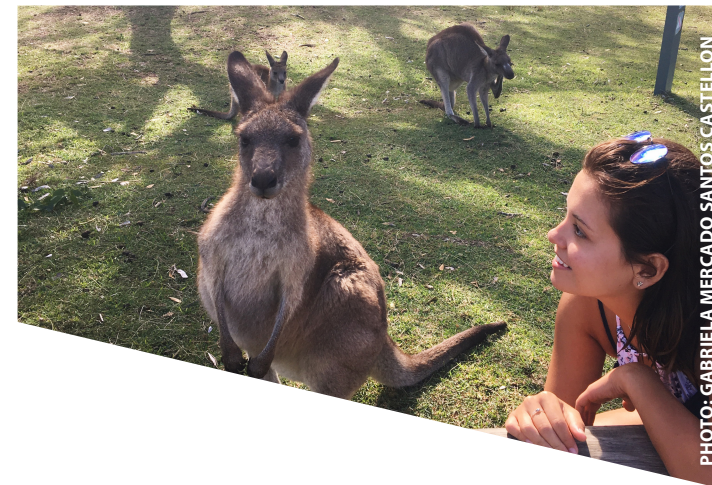
