WHAT AID CAN I USE FOR STUDY ABROAD?

You can apply any federal or state financial aid you already have (HOPE, Zell Miller, student loans, etc.) to UGA study abroad or exchange programs, as well as to external study abroad programs approved by UGA's Office of Global Engagement. However, out-of-state tuition waivers (e.g., Classics scholarships) cannot be used on non-UGA programs.

You also may qualify for merit- and need-based scholarships. Contact our office and the Office of Student Financial Aid to review your financial aid package for study abroad.

HOW DO I APPLY MY AID TO MY PROGRAM?

Students studying abroad with UGA programs only need to meet the standard requirements to receive financial aid. Once accepted into a UGA-sponsored program for direct credit (e.g., residential center or faculty-led programs), financial aid disbursement is the same as if on-campus; therefore, no additional paperwork is required.

In order to have your exchange or non-UGA program credits approved, you must fill out a Transfer Credit Approval Form (TCAF) **before** leaving the country in order to have the credits you earn count toward your degree. This will allow you to maintain enrollment and financial aid eligibility at UGA. Once your completed TCAF is on file, you are eligible to receive financial aid. In most cases, you will receive financial aid approximately 10 days before your program starts.

Because of variation between academic calendars at foreign institutions and UGA, there may be some delay in receiving transcripts from partner universities and processing credits. This delay may temporarily affect your financial aid eligibility and status until UGA receives your study abroad program transcript.

DOES STUDY ABROAD COST MORE FOR OUT-OF-**STATE STUDENTS?**

Out-of-state students will be charged tuition at the in-state rate for credits earned through all UGA exchanges and UGA faculty-led and international centers study abroad programs.


