Visa Information	<p>Before applying for a visa, students need to apply for a Certificate of Eligibility (CoE) for resident status at the regional Immigration Service Agency of Japan. International Student Office will act as a proxy and apply for the CoE on behalf of the exchange students. General Requirements	<p>1. Applicants must be enrolled at Kagoshima University's partner university at the time of application. Also, they must be continuously enrolled until the end of the exchange period.</p> <p>2. Exchange students must cover their living expenses while in Japan (More than 70,000-80,000 JPY/month is needed.).</p> <p>3. Extension or shortening of exchange period is not permitted after submitting application.</p> <p>4. Exchange Students need to leave Japan as soon as classes finish.</p>

Accommodation	<p>Kagoshima University has 3 dormitories (International Residence Hall (IRH) bldgs. No.1-3) for international students. International Student Office will arrange one of the rooms (single rooms only) for all exchange students.</p> <p>Kagoshima University International Residence Hall: https://www.kagoshima-u.ac.jp/kokusai/kuirhoutline.pdf</p> <p>* Smoking is prohibited in all Kagoshima University premises including International Residence Halls. *The International Residence Halls do not have car parking facilities.</p>
Expected fees	<p><u>Tuition</u>: Tuition fee, entrance examination fee and entrance fee will be waived.</p> <p><u>Accommodation, meals and daily expenses</u>: must be paid by the students.</p> <p><u>Living Expenses in Kagoshima</u>: https://www.kagoshima-u.ac.jp/en/global-contents/living-expenses-in-kagoshima.html</p> <p><u>Insurance</u>: International students who stay in Japan more than 3 months must join the National Health Insurance. Once they are insured under the National Health Insurance, students need to pay only 30% of the actual cost. The premium is about 2,000 yen per month. In addition, it is mandatory to enrol in “Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research (PAS)” and “Comprehensive Insurance for Students Lives Coupled with “Gakkensai” for International Students (Inbound futai-gakuso)”. They should also join overseas traveler’s and health insurance programs available in their home countries.
