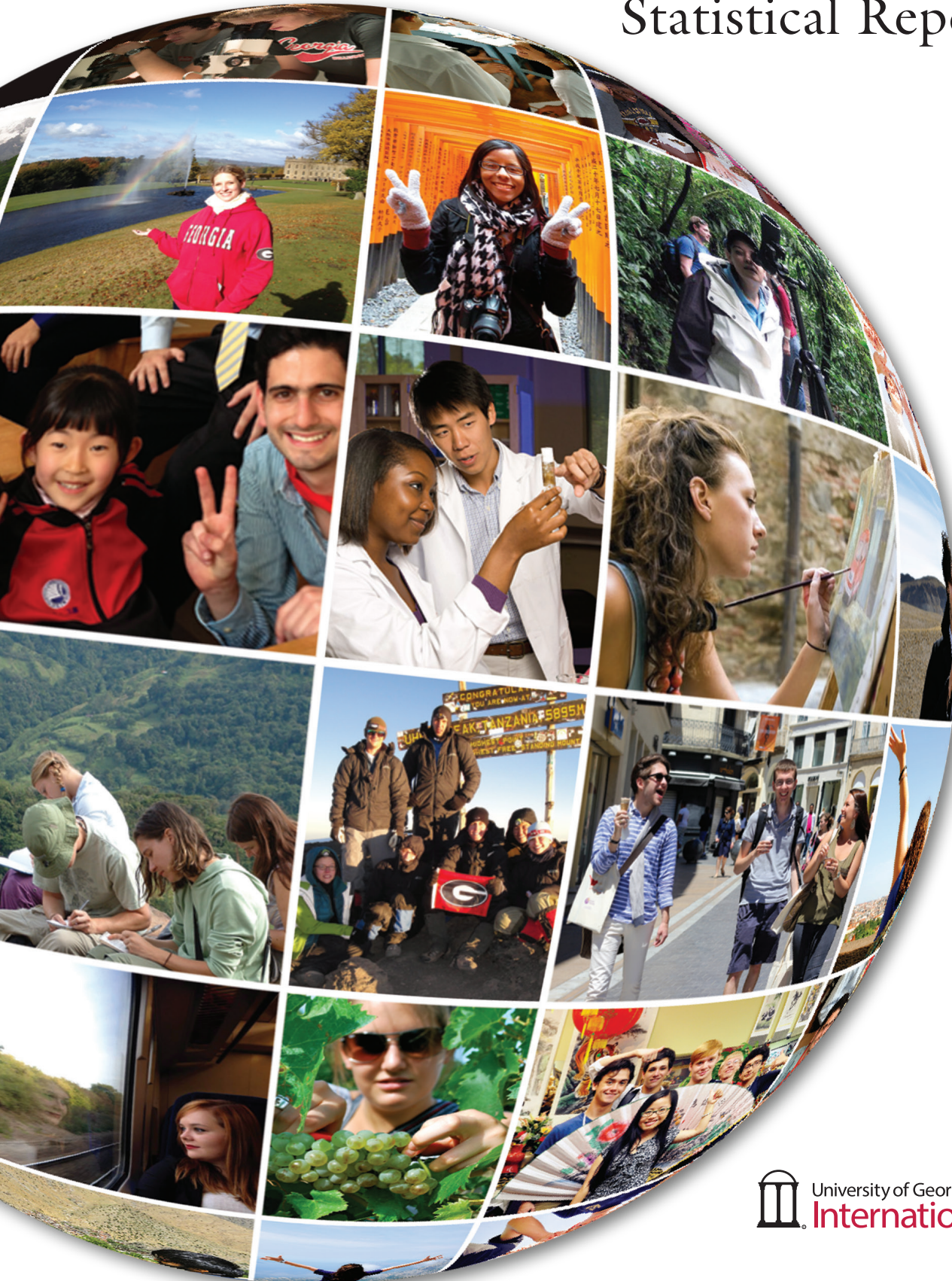

# Study Abroad



UGA offers a wide range of study abroad opportunities for students and faculty in over 50 countries. Each year, more than 2,000 UGA students attend one of the 100 programs available, ranging from 10 days to a full semester, or a full-year abroad.

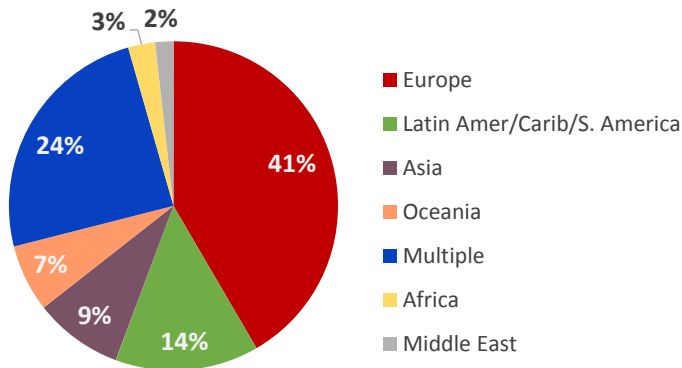
Financial aid opportunities through scholarships for students studying abroad include OIE scholarships, national scholarship competitions, external program scholarships and discounts, country/region specific scholarships, and UGA scholarships sponsored by colleges, departments, or individual programs.

Over the past seven years, participation in study abroad has been steady at around 2,000 students per year. The Institute of Higher Education's most recent Open Doors report, based on 2011-2012 numbers, ranked UGA among the top fifteen institutions in the U.S. for study abroad participation.

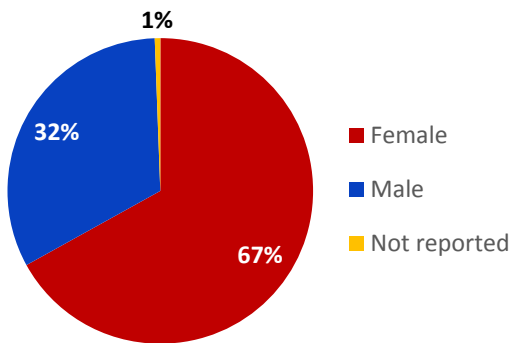

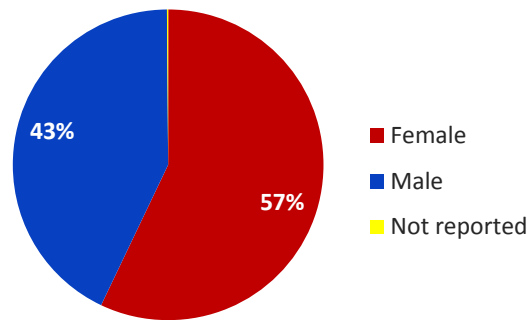
## Participation in 2012-2013 by Demographic Groups

#### Study Abroad Students

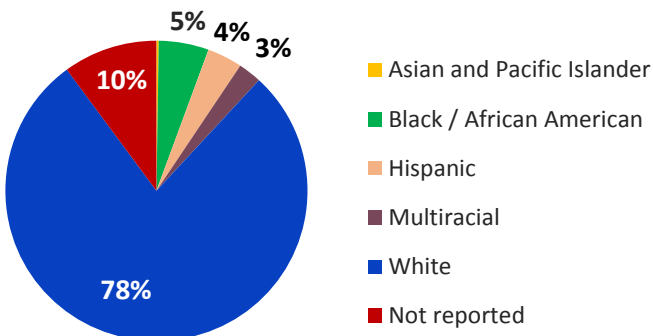

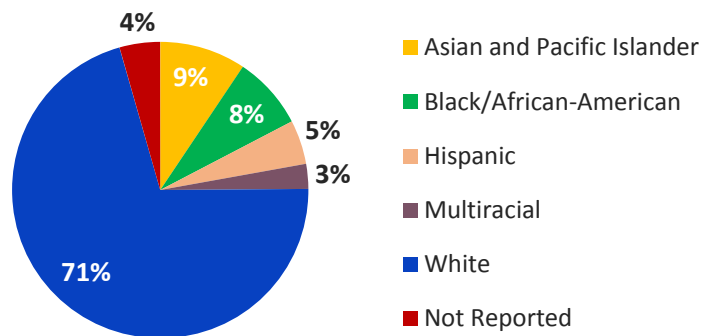

# Study Abroad at UGA Residential Centers

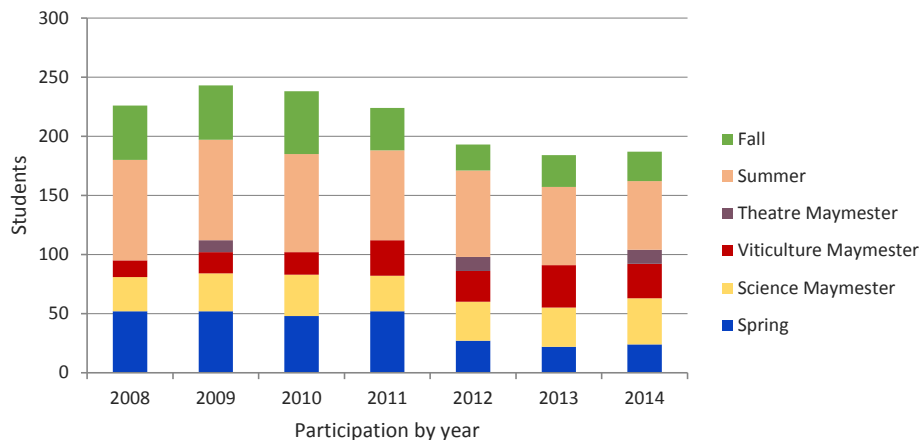


## Cortona

UGA's Cortona Residential Center envisions its setting, offerings and cultural immersion to uniquely cultivate enhanced learning and international understanding. A long-term relationship between the program and the town of Cortona, along with its strongly developed curriculum, provides an interdisciplinary approach with regard to research, teaching and cultural exchange in an international setting.

The program provides a challenging opportunity for the serious student who wishes to combine an intensive studio fine arts and/or classroom experience with immersion in Tuscan hill town life. The program also offers a richer experience of Italy and its arts through hand-picked professors who teach challenging studio and lecture-based courses and lead research on native monuments and diverse cities, visited throughout the course of study.

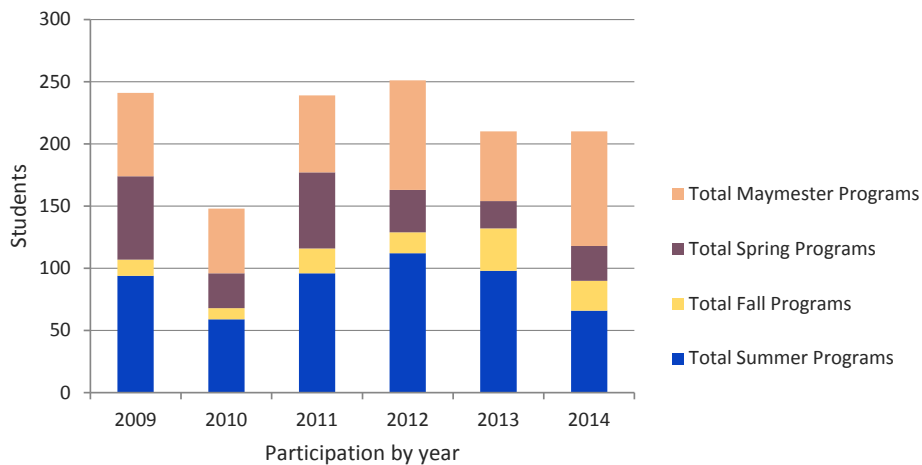
# Costa Rica

UGA Costa Rica seeks to advance our understanding—through instruction, research, and outreach—of the interconnected nature of human and environmental systems, particularly the concepts of socio-cultural, ecological, and economic sustainability.

UGA Costa Rica offers over 20 unique education abroad programs spanning more than 40 majors over the course of the academic year. Long-term research projects include moth and butterfly studies, a regional water quality monitoring program, a reforestation program, monthly citizen science bird monitoring, a permanent forest plot, and a meteorological station gathering climate data.

In 2013, UGA Costa Rica was honored by GoAbroad.com with the 2013 Innovation in Sustainability Award, and the UGA Costa Rica campus is third-party certified as adhering to the highest sustainability standards by the Certification for Sustainable Tourism program.

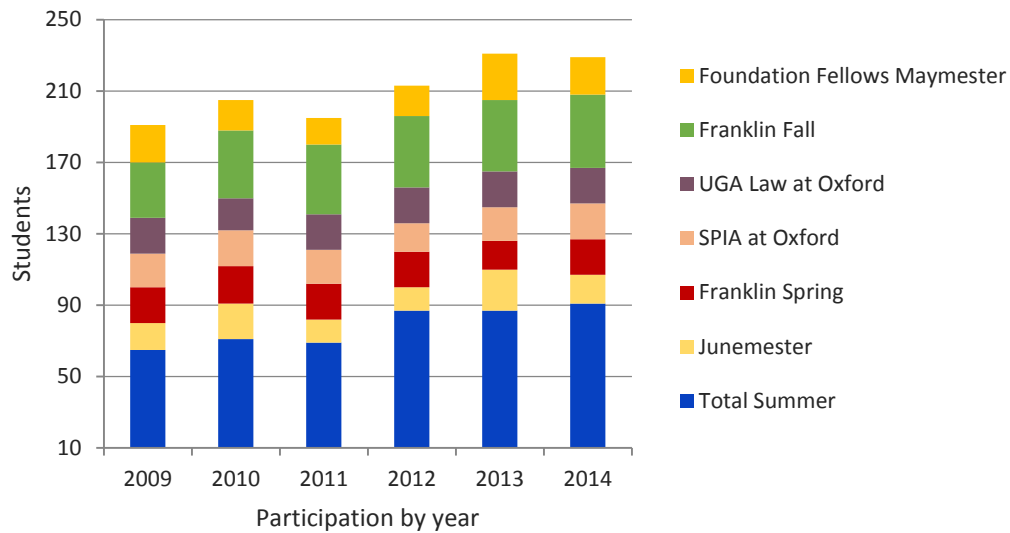


## Oxford

The UGA at Oxford Program provides study abroad opportunities for UGA students year-round. Participants are required to take a full load of courses while on the Program, choosing from a list of over 100 options in a variety of subject areas. One class is taught each semester by an onsite UGA faculty member using a traditional lecture or seminar format; the remaining classes are taught by University of Oxford faculty using that institution's traditional tutorial format. Students meet with their professor in small groups of 1-3 students and are generally required to write at least one essay per week, per class.

During the fall and spring semesters, students reside in the UGA Oxford Center, which can house a maximum of 40 students. During the Summer sessions, additional housing is available in Oxford's Trinity College, allowing for a larger number of students to participate. UGA's affiliation with Oxford's Keble College provides UGA students with associate membership, giving them dining hall, library, and extra-curricular access to a wide variety of intellectual and social activities.

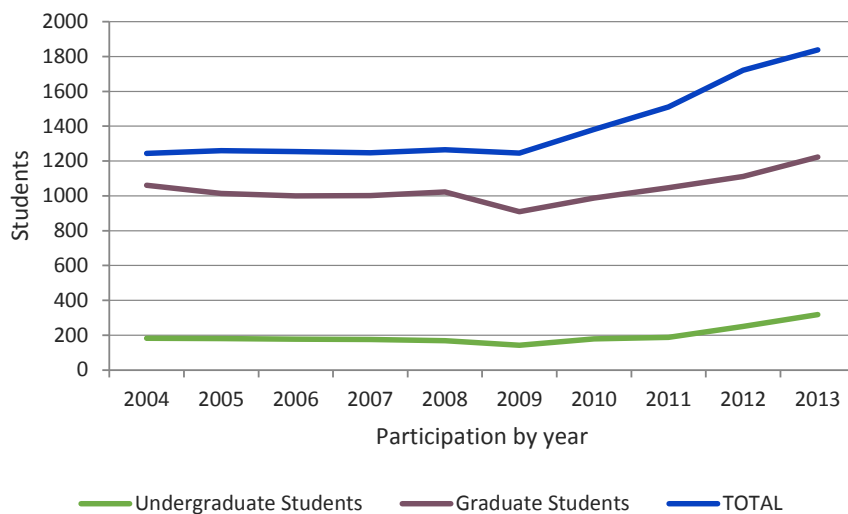
# International Students and Scholars



International students and scholars are significant assets to the university community. International students bring a diversity of ideas and experiences to the classroom and the campus and provide U.S.-born students new perspectives on global challenges and competition. International scholars, faculty, and staff represent the very best of the global talent pool and advance UGA's research, teaching, and service missions.

Over the past five years, there has been a steady growth in the number of international students at UGA. Two-thirds of international students at UGA are graduate students. However undergraduate student enrollment is increasing at a very high rate and has doubled since 2009. In addition to the degree-seeking students shown in the graphs, UGA welcomed 48 non-degree international students in 2013. These students spend up to a year at UGA as exchange or sponsored students.

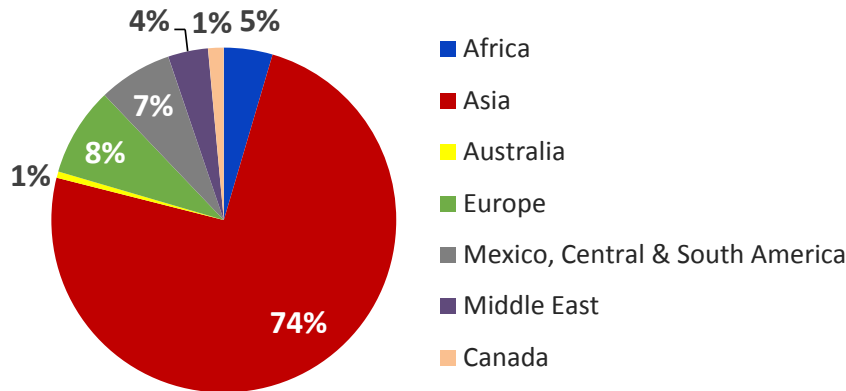

## International Students by Region of Origin, Fall 2013

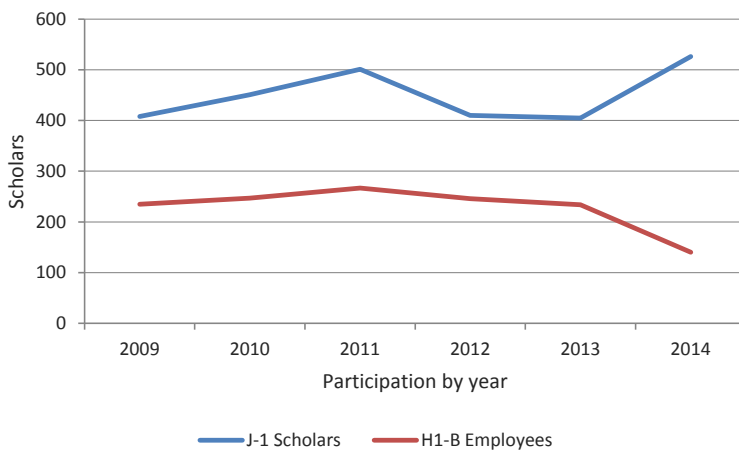

International scholars at UGA include J-1 (exchange) scholars and those on the H1-B visa. J-1 scholars contribute to UGA as post-docs, research scientists, and instructors. Employees on H-1B visas are hired as work faculty/staff in specialty fields as defined by the U.S. government and bring outstanding skills and expertise to the university. Every year the International Student, Scholar and Immigration Services (ISSIS) unit processes up to 35 permanent residency cases.

Fluctuation in the number of international scholars at UGA is usually linked to the start and end of major research grants and faculty hiring initiatives. Except for an uptick in 2011, the number of international scholars at UGA has remained relatively stable between 2009 and 2014.

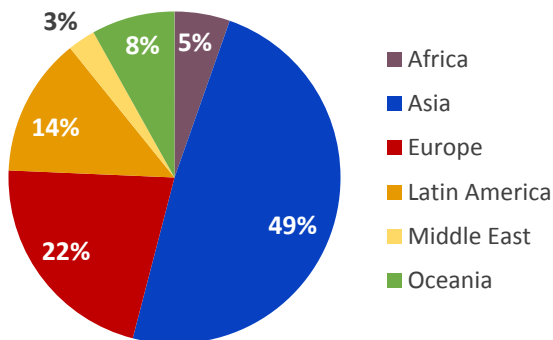
# International Partnerships



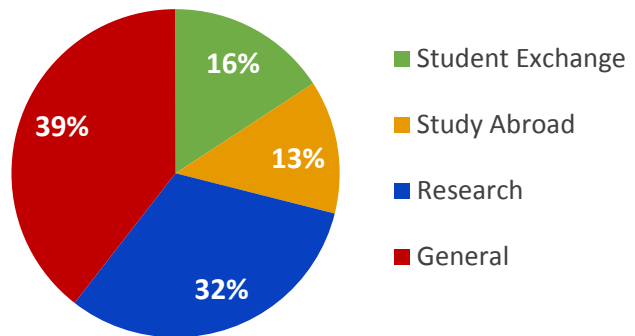
Currently, UGA has international cooperative agreements (ICAs) with approximately 190 universities and institutions. These include more than 50 universities with which UGA has undergraduate student exchange agreements. Additional collaborative activities include research, faculty and graduate student mobility, capacity building, and training. Formal International Cooperative Agreements (ICAs) generally expire after five years unless renewed.

During the academic year of 2012-2013, there were over 50 new and renewed ICAs, including, among others: Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (CSIRO, Australia), Centro Nacional de Pesquisa em Energia e Materiais (CNPEM, Brazil), Guangxi Cancer Institute (China), Makerere University (Uganda), and Twin (a registered charity and membership organization of the fair trade movement, U.K.).
