Gonzaga Hall

Located on campus beside the rear gate, Gonzaga Hall (International Student Dormitory) can accommodate up to 900 students in double rooms. The dorm houses students from all over the world in a multicultural atmosphere. The primary language used in the Hall is Korean, and equally English and Chinese as well.

Bellarmino Dormitory

The Bellarmino dormitory is 5-minute walk from the Sogang campus. It houses 332 students, 200 male students and 132 female students. There are 4 students per room.







Students at Sogang University have access to various facilities offered on campus such as the Loyola Library, state-of-the-art multimedia classrooms, the gymnasium, and dormitories. Sogang also provides a variety of counseling services for students in need.

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Loyola Library

Sogang University's Loyola Library was built in 1960 to coincide with the opening of the university, and initially housed on the second level of the Administration Building (The A Hall). The current four-story building was built in February 1974, and named after Saint Ignatius of Loyola (1491-1551), a founder of the Jesuit order of Catholic priests. It is the first library in Korea to operate according to the full open system.

Currently, Loyola Library operates on three different sites: Loyola 2 (constructed in 1982) and Loyola 3 (constructed in 1997).

Also, the university's Law Library is established on the first floor of the Xavier Hall.

In 1986, an automatic loan service was introduced by the library; the barcode and anti-theft systems have operated since 1991. PC, VTR, CDP, LDP, and satellite broadcasting television and multimedia rooms accommodate various media. Study carrels are provided for postgraduate students.

In total, the library contains 1,000,000 books, 6,000 periodicals, 40,000 references, microfilms, audio-video resources, rare resources, e-journals, and e-books. The library contains 150 PCs. Each year, the library hosts a "Library week" event in order to familiarize new users with facilities.

Gymnasium

Gymnasium was completed in 1980 and consists of 1 basement floor and 3 ground floors with the area of 5,632 square meters, that can hold up to 3,500 spectators. This building has volleyball and basketball courts, 3 faculty offices, 1 administrative office, 1 classroom, 14 student club activity rooms, 3 table tennis rooms, 2 training rooms, 3 handball courts (racket ball courts), 2 locker and shower rooms for the team, 2 changing and shower rooms, 1 sanitary room, 1 equipment room, and such facilities that are worthy of the name as the university gymnasium.



Programs for International Students

Every semester, Sogang University receives students in diverse disciplines from all over the world. EXCHANGE STUDENT PROGRAM

Sogang University welcomes undergraduate and graduate students from colleges and universities, which have academic exchange agreements with Sogang. Currently, Sogang has joint academic agreements with 360 partner universities in 65 countries, including many Jesuit universities (as of April 2019). Students interested in participating in the student exchange program should submit the required documents before the deadline in order to apply. Students should contact the Study Abroad Office at their home institution for more information regarding study abroad at Sogang University. International students participating in the exchange program may register for courses offered in Korean or English to take up to 15 credits per semester. International Relations

Scholarships

Sogang GSIS offers scholarships of 25%~100% of tuition to new students according to their performance in the admissions process. 
