Introducing Britain	This summer programme gives an overview of British culture, history and politics over the past three hundred years, focussing on crucial historical events and their impact on Britain. It can be taken as a stand-alone programme or prior to study at Lancaster or another British university. Introducing Britain is equivalent to a first-year undergraduate Lancaster University course. Students who complete this course are awarded 3 US / 6 ECTS credits or 4 US / 8 ECTS credits. The amount of credits depends on which version of the course the student chooses.
	Arrival: 7 th July 2018 Programme: 8 th July - 28 th July 2018
	The programme provides an opportunity to experience life at a British university while learning about the history and culture of the UK, and specifically the North-West of England. As well as experiencing lectures by renowned academics, students will be able to discuss the course topics in small seminar groups and go on field trips to relevant sites in the North-West of England each week.
Understanding Britain	It can be taken as a stand-alone programme or prior to study at Lancaster or another British university.
(Formerly known as International Summer Programme)	Understanding Britain is a more advanced module equivalent to a second-year course. Students who complete this course are awarded 4 US / 8 ECTS credits. Arrival: 15 th August 2018 Orientation: 16 th & 17 th August 2018 Programme: 20 th August – 14 th September 2018
International Cultural Experience (ICE)	The Lancaster International Cultural Experience (ICE) supports students in developing key global competencies and in doing so, positions them as global citizens. Students will have the option to study a 3 US credits/ 6 ECTS credits Lancaster module of Intercultural Competencies and Community Engagement, which provides experiential learning and gives an insight into what it means to work collaboratively, communicate within internationalised teams, show resilience and understand multiple perspectives. Arrival: 21st July 2018 Programme: 22nd July -11th August 2018
English for Academic Purposes (EAP)	The English for Academic Purposes Programme is for international students intending to study at Lancaster University, who are required or wish to improve their English language and study skills before starting their programme. Arrival: 1 st /2 nd September 2018 Programme: 3 rd September – 28 th September 2018
Study Start Programme (SSP)	Study Start is a 2-week induction course designed to help international students get the best possible start for their time at Lancaster University. Arrival: 15 th /16 th September 2018 Programme: 17 th September – 28 th September 2018
