Profile	<p>Founded in 1386, Heidelberg University is Germany's oldest university. It is a comprehensive research-oriented institution with a strong focus on interdisciplinary studies. Heidelberg University offers over 160 study programs in the humanities, the social sciences, law, natural sciences, and the life sciences, including medicine.</p> <p>More than 30,000 Students study at Heidelberg University. Among them, ca. 5,800 International Students. (ca. 50% European, 30% Asian, 12% North/South American, 5% Africa)</p> <p>Rankings: 42 worldwide, 1 in Germany (Shanghai Ranking 2017) 45 worldwide, 3 in Germany (THE World University Rankings 2017/18);</p>

<p>Language of Instruction</p>	<p>Typically, courses are taught in the German language. German Language Instruction	
Preparatory Language course	<p>Exchange students may take part in a 4-week intensive language course at the International Study Center before the start of the semester (offered in September for fall semester students and in March for spring semester students).</p> <p>The program includes 80 hours of language instruction at all levels (basic, intermediate and advanced). All courses contain exercises dealing with German grammar, conversation, reading and writing, listening comprehension, lexis, phonetics, regional and cultural studies, and information about studying in Heidelberg.</p> <p>http://www.isz.uni-heidelberg.de/e_courses_vdk.html</p> <p>The fee for this course is covered by the International Relations Office for exchange students.</p>
German Language Instruction	<p>Students who seek additional support regarding their German language proficiency during the lecture period are offered a large variety of different language programs at the University's International Study Center (ISZ).</p> <p>Students may choose between a 4 and an 8 hour per week general German language course. In addition, the ISZ has a large variety of subject-related courses all exchange students may take part in. These courses complement the regular courses offered at the University. Intensive German Language Course	<p>Students without or with limited German language experience have the opportunity to attend a full time <i>intensive</i> (20 hour per week) language course in which 24 ECTS can be earned per semester.</p> <p>*A shortened option may be available upon request in the fall semester to permit US students to return to their home institutions for the winter/spring semester. (ca. 16 ECTS)</p>
Intercultural German Studies (<i>Germanistik in Kulturvergleich</i>)	<p>The Institute for German as a Foreign Language Philology (IDF) offers various degree programs as well as a broad spectrum of courses especially developed for short-term, non-degree students. Exchange students will find courses geared to improve their language competency as well a large variety of German studies courses. Accommodation	<p>Exchange students from overseas are privileged to receive guaranteed student housing. Fees of student housing	<p>Approx. 220 – 350 EURO / Month 450 EURO refundable deposit</p>
Special housing needs	<p>Students who have special housing needs due to a disability, allergy or other health problems should inform the exchange coordinator and indicate this on their application.</p>
Cost of Living / Financial Planning	<p>Approx. 735 - 800 EURO per month</p> <p>Please refer to the information given on this website: http://www.uni-heidelberg.de/courses/prospective/admission_int/guide/pre-departure_information.html</p>
Insurance	<p>Health insurance is compulsory for all Heidelberg University students. Students staying for one semester only can either bring sufficient health insurance coverage from their country of residence or take out health insurance in Germany. Students staying for a full academic year must take out German health insurance.</p> <p>Avg. price of comprehensive insurance per month: 80 EURO *state insurance in Germany is very comprehensive! **students aged 30 and above do not qualify for state health insurance and have to purchase private insurance http://www.uni-heidelberg.de/courses/prospective/admission_int/guide/pre-departure_information.html https://www.studentenwerke.de/sites/default/files/gesundheitswoerterbuch.pdf</p> <p>Students are also strongly recommended to take out personal liability insurance (Haftpflichtversicherung) for their stay in Germany, as well as extra insurance coverage at home for the period between arrival and enrolment at Heidelberg University.</p>
