2.4. Grading system

30 ECTS= 1 semester (full-time studies); 60 ECTS= 2 semesters (full-time studies); 1 ECTS=25-30 hours of work of the student (class, study, homework, exams...).

The grading scale goes from 0 to 20 with pass level at 10.

International student transcripts also include the ECTS grade, reflecting the relative position of a grade in a certain reference group.

4.1. MS degree: Plant Breeding

The Master in Plant Breeding trains future breeders and combines:

- Plant Improvement, Plant Breeding and Selection
- Biotechnologies, Cellular and Molecular Biology, Molecular Markers as breeding supports
- Core technologies in molecular and cellular biology: biomathematics and computational biology

The program lasts 23 months with at least 8 months in France. The academic program starts each year early September.

Topics of study include processing data from connected devices such as drones, satellites, tablets and smartphones and data on the behavior of stakeholders in a given field, and managing and analyzing big data for decision making purposes.

4.6. Short Program: Geological Field School in France

Students will experience hands-on geological exploration in small groups. Extend learning from the classroom to the field in sequence stratigraphy and with a transect of the Alps. The field school will also introduce the participants to cross-cultural management, geological mapping and petrography. Accommodation is provided on campus for all incoming students in the international residence where they have access to a shared kitchen. Students can choose between a single or double room:

- Single room with a private bathroom (restroom and shower) = approx. € 488 / month
- Double room (for 2 students) with bunk beds and a shared bathroom = approx. € 270 / month

Standard room (single and double rooms are both standard) contains a bunk bed (single size mattress and sheets), 2 desks with a chair, 2 wardrobe and shelves; inside the bathroom you have a sink, a shower and toilets. Towels, blanket, pillow and sheets are provided.



The international students are entitled to an accommodation allowance (APL/ALS) from the French Government (cf. Student Guide for other details)

Students can either choose a single bedroom or a flat.

Description of the accommodations:

• Single room (approx. € 235 / month) is furnished with a single bed, a desk, a chair, a wardrobe, a bathroom (shower, sink, toilets), a shared kitchen.



• Flat (approx. € 329.70 / month) is furnished with a single bed, a desk, a chair, a dining table and 2 chairs, a wardrobe, a bathroom (sink, shower, toilets), a kitchen space (fridge, cooking hobs).

The rent fees include tax, heat, electricity, water (cold and hot), common areas cleaning, personal codes for WIFI. The cleaning of the room/flat is the responsibility of the student.
