COVID-19: Precautions & Symptoms

Precautions to Take

The following advice about preventing the spread of COVID-19 is taken from the CDC's guidance on <u>How to Protect Yourself & Others</u> web page. Go to that page for further details on the precautions listed below.

- 1. Wash your hands often.
- 2. Avoid close contact (with people).
- 3. Cover your mouth and nose with a cloth face cover when around others.
- 4. Cover coughs and sneezes.
- 5. Clean and disinfect.
- 6. Monitor your health.

Potential Symptoms of COVID-19

- 1. Fever (temperature greater than 100.4) within the last 14 days
- 2. Cough within the last 14 days
- 3. Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath within the last 14 days
- 4. Chills or repeated shaking within the last 14 days
- 5. New or unexplained muscle pain within the last 14 days
- 6. Loss of taste or smell within the last 14 days
- 7. New or unusual headache within the last 14 days
- 8. Sore throat within the last 14 days
- 9. Nausea, vomiting or diarrhea within the last 14 days
- 10. Contact* with a person with a confirmed case of COVID-19 within the last 14 days
- 11. Contact* with a person with a suspected case of COVID-19 within the last 14 days

COVID-19: International Travel

Travel Registration

If you are a UGA student traveling abroad, you must register your travel with UGA's Global Education office.

- If you are studying abroad, you must apply to the appropriate program on the <u>StudyAway Portal</u>.
- If you are traveling abroad as a UGA student but not earning academic credit, then you should fill out one of the Travel Registry applications.

<u>Cultural Insurance Services International - CISI</u>

The University System of Georgia partners with CISI for international health insurance, which includes travel assistance. Please review OGE's <u>information regarding Insurance</u>, including the <u>CISI Insurance Policy</u> for additional information.

Electronic Safety Card

The Electronic Safety Information Card, fueled by Aerogami, is a contact card stored in the Contacts app of smartphones containing important UGA emergency contact information, such as the 24/7 UGA police emergency number and a link to Online Incident Report for reporting incidents while abroad.

Downloading the Electronic Safety Card:

- Text Message: text the word UGAEA to (505) 544-4999; OR
- Web Browser: using your phone, go to kup4u.com/company/UGAEA; OR
- QR Code: scan the QR Code



AlertTraveler

AlertTraveler is a mobile application for iOS and Android devices that utilizes GPS and the travel itinerary of a program application in the StudyAway Portal. AlertTraveler provides you with country and city intelligence to help you make informed decisions while traveling, safety and security alerts to let you know of any events that could potentially impact your travel or safety, and an instant check-in option allowing you to report your status back to UGA in case of an incident.
